Dear parents,

Circular on "The Education Bureau supports cross-boundary students in primary and secondary schools "

It has been more than one year since the outbreak of the 2019 Coronavirus Disease. Cross-boundary students travelling between the two places to go to school depends on the development of the epidemic situation in Hong Kong and Mainland China, and the coordination between the two places. At this stage, the Education Bureau cannot arrange cross-boundary students to resume face-to-face classes in Hong Kong. In order to strengthen the support for cross-boundary students living in Shenzhen, the Education Bureau has commissioned the organizer "International Social Service Hong Kong (ISSHK)" to conduct "Psychological and Social Support Courses" and "Learning Support Courses" in Luohu, Futian and Nanshan District in Shenzhen. Students who intend to participate must be nominated by the school. In order to make full use of resources, the bureau does not accept schools nominating the same student to participate in two courses. The selected students will participate in a 16-hour group or face-to-face course in the "Psychosocial Support Course" or "Learning Support Course". Parents are required to participate in the conclusion of the last session of the class. It is free of charge. Class hours are Monday to Friday afternoon and Saturday morning or afternoon. Students' participation is voluntary. The curriculum objectives of the two courses are as follows:

(1) "Psychosocial Support Course" (for cross-boundary students from P.1 to S.6)

1. Strengthen students understanding of their own emotional and social needs;
2. Enhance students' social and emotional management skills and broaden their social network; and
3. Promote students' positive thinking and enhance their ability to cope with adversity and pressure.

(2) "Learning Support Course" (for cross-boundary students from P.1 to S.3)

1. Consolidate students' knowledge and skills in core subjects;
2. Enrich students' learning experience outside of Hong Kong school learning activities;
3. Through interactive communication with tutors and other students, broaden students' thinking perspectives and learning capabilities;
4. Cultivate students' positive values and attitudes, and develop students' generic skills; and
5. Improve students' online and distance learning strategies.


