School report of May

1. Teachers' professional development

- a. Ms. Kwok participated in the certificate course of Professional Development Programme on the Teaching of Chinese Language for Non-Chinese Speaking Students from April 26 to May 29, and conducted five weeks of professional training in support of non-Chinese speaking students.
- b. Congratulations to Principal Chow and Miss Leong for receiving the Good Service Award from the Community Youth Club of the Education Bureau.

2. Students' all-round development

- a. Our school held an interdisciplinary gratitude activity with the theme of Mother's Day, including Chinese wish card writing, English writing competition, Music Radio Programme, Book Sharing, Visual Arts group Mother's Day card making, and gratitude photography, etc. Students experience gratitude through activities, learn to cherish family and others' care for themselves, and express gratitude through words and actions.
- b. Our school displayed the Chinese White Dolphin exhibition board during May. During the exhibition, students actively participated in the quiz game. Our school believed that they have a deeper understanding of the life habits, distribution, and conservation of Chinese White Dolphins.
- c. In response to the 4.23 World Reading Day, our school held a series of reading-related activities in April and May to allow students to develop their reading interest through multiple reading activities. In one of the activities, the Detective Theatre 'When the Story Becomes True', the students turned into little detectives, led by the teachers to asked different questions to various characters in the story. The activity was very interesting and the students were very engaged.
- d. On May 18, our school held the Chinese Martial Arts Experience Day, allowing students to experience two traditional martial arts, Shaolin Kungfu and Tai Chi. This martial arts education promotion activity not only allowed students to realize that martial arts can cultivate their body and strengthen their bodies, but also helped them relieve their physical and mental stress.
- e. On May 21, a charity organized a 'Community Education Carnival' for students. Students learned the skills of communicating with the disabled by participating in different booth activities and understanding the information displayed on the Educational van. Thus, students could better understand their needs and learn empathy and the importance of creating an inclusive and harmonious community.
- f. On May 17 and 28, our school arranged two Putonghua drama performances. The drama was an interactive drama that introduced commonly used Putonghua through interesting and vivid scenes. The students were also invited to help the hero of the story answer questions about Putonghua. The students devoted themselves to the content of the story and answered the questions enthusiastically.

- a. On May 15, our school held a positive parent workshop, where parents and their children worked together. During the activity, parents practiced how to get along with the children through positive speaking and effective teaching.
