School report, May

1. Teacher Professional Development

- a. Mr. Wong Kam On, Ms. Tong Wing Shan, Ms. Lam Tso Wing, Mr. Kwan Chun Hoi, Mr. Law Chuen Lee and Mr. Mong Chi Chui participated in the Online Knowledge Enrichment Programmes on Constitution and Basic Law, National Security and Belt and Road Initiative and Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macao Greater Bay Area.
- b. The school has installed interactive TV in every classroom to improve teaching efficiency. On 26th May, all teachers participated in the IT Training Workshop. Teachers could better understand the functions of the interactive TV.

2. Holistic Development of students

- a. Our school held a series of Mother's Day activities from 3rd to 6th of May. The Guidance Team together with the English Department and the Music Development, organized various kinds of activities, including poster displays, video sharing, greeting card writing, pins design, etc., so that students can learn to value family affection, express their love to their mothers and cultivate their gratitude.
- b. To enhance students' knowledge and awareness of firefly conservation and nature care, the school arranged a Firefly Parade for P. 5 students on 18th May. Students started to raise fireflies in the "Life Education Trail" on campus. Students learned about the characteristics of fireflies, observed aquatic insects closely and made firefly crafts. Students also have the opportunity to observe fireflies in the dark and learn how to feed and care for fireflies.
- c. On 26th May, the school celebrated the birthday of more than 90 birthday stars. The theme of the birthday party was "Be thankful", hoping that students could learn to thank the people around them through songs. Students sang birthday songs and sent their best wishes to one another. Teachers wrote greetings on specially designed birthday cards to the birthday stars and a short video was shared on the screen with all students during the party.
- d. The May Awards Presentation Ceremony was held on 27th May. A number of external academics, artistic awards and certificates were presented, including Mathematics competition, English Drama Competition, eco-bag design competition, drawing Competition, open piano competition, etc. On the same day, teachers and students celebrated their achievements and hoped that students would continue to show their strengths and make further achievements.

3. Home-school Cooperation

- a. On 13th January, our school held a charity flower sale for the Community Chest. Many students and their parents supported the activity by buying potted plants or donating directly. Our school raised \$4600 in total for the Community Chest.
- b. Parents are requested to ensure that their children's temperature, rapid test have been taken before they come to school every day.
