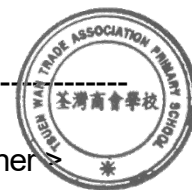

1. Teacher Professional Development

- a. Mr. Lee Sheung Lok participated in the professional refresher course on "Developing Computational Thinking in Writing Mobile Applications" from 25th April to 31st May.
- b. Mr. Lee Sheung Lok, Ms. Wong Chuk Kwan, Mr. Mong Chi Chui and Mr. Yiu Wai Lun attended the 39-hour teacher development course "Programming Education and Development of Operational Thinking" organized by the Jockey Club in order to effectively cultivate students' Learning and develop operational thinking education in the school.

2. Holistic Development of students

- a. Our students attended the award presentation ceremony of the STEM Competition on 2nd June to congratulate them on their outstanding achievements in the competition. This competition is a good way to boost students' motivation to play sports as their opportunities to play sports are reduced during the pandemic. This competition requires students to perform specific physical challenges every day using smart watches connected to smart phones, which can not only develop the habit of doing exercises, but also enable students to learn about sports technology.
- b. The school was shortlisted in the "Chinese Historical Personages Play" radio Drama Competition of "Ancient and Modern People magazine - Values" (2021/2022 academic year) and recorded at RTHK studios on 8th June. Our work will be combined with 19 more primary and secondary schools and will be sent to all primary and secondary schools in Hong Kong. During the competition, students gained valuable experience in getting to know Chinese historical figures, receiving training from teachers, learning about the production of radio plays, recording on the radio and being interviewed by radio presenters. The teachers appreciated the efforts of the students, and the students appreciated the school for providing them with different learning opportunities and experiences.
- c. Students participated in the Hong Kong Chapter of the UNESCO (United Nations educational, scientific and cultural organization), children's artistic and cultural exchange association. They joined the Hong Kong Institute of Education for Sustainable Development for the UN Marine "Children hand in hand with ceramic" programme. The students participated in the media production of marine works of art, "ceramics" and participated in the auction and exhibition in the hope that other people will focus on ocean conservation issues. The student works were exhibited at central Market from 8th to 12th June, and two of the works were snapped up by donations from patrons of the arts.
- d. Our school held a series of Father's Day appreciation education activities from 13th to 17th June. Together with the English department and the Visual Arts Department, the Guidance Team organized a series of Father's Day gratitude activities. Through poster displays, video sharing, heartfelt thoughts and cards, students were able to express their love for their fathers and cultivate their gratitude.
- e. Our school and Beijing Dacheng School held a wonderful online "Bilingual Competition" on 20th June. A total of 10 students from our school and Beijing Dacheng School gave a speech in Chinese and an English speech titled Shandong Travel Journal respectively. The students presented in a variety of styles, and their sincere feelings moved the audience again and again.
- f. Music Office tutors came to the school on 22nd June to conduct the "iJam Music Creation" workshop for our students. They taught students to create music with GarageBand, from basic software operation to other hardware, making it easy and simple to create their own music.
- g. On 26th June, 10 students went to Tuen Mun Park Children's Playground to learn about the different inclusive facilities in the park. The event invited Gary Leung, a visually impaired person, to share with students how to overcome various difficulties or challenges in life. During the activities, students completed various minor tasks to experience the importance of inclusive facilities.

- h. The school has been actively involved in environmental conservation activities to educate students about the environment and nature conservation. The school was invited by Ocean Park to participate in the Summer Adventure course on 26th June to deepen students' understanding of animals, marine ecology and conservation through various games and group activities. Students prepared food for meerkats and Aldabra tortoises, learned about the habits of various animals and enhanced their understanding of animals and conservation. In addition, students used their senses and learned English, scientific thinking and team spirit through various scavenger hunts and group activities.
- i. Our year 3 students participated in the Community Art Workshop "Sai Yau Kee" organised by the Hong Kong Tourism Board and the Department of Cultural and Creative Arts of the University of Education of Hong Kong. Students learned Mosaic art, using coloured bricks to create art works about the characteristics of west Kowloon and Jordan's old districts. Students' works were exhibited at the Art pavilion of the West Kowloon Cultural District. Students and their parents were also present to appreciate their own and children's works and other art works from different schools, as well as to experience the rich and unique artistic atmosphere of West Kowloon.

3. Home-school Cooperation

- a. On 2nd June, parents of the school participated in a positive parenting workshop organized by harmony House. Through various experiential activities, including discussion, games and role play, parents learned to improve parent-child relationships and deal with their children's emotional and behavioural challenges with positive attitudes and skills.
- b. Parents are requested to ensure that their children's temperature has been taken and a rapid test has been taken before they come to school every day. They should sign the record form and take a photo of the rapid test results for the daily or future record checking. Remember that a negative test result is required to enter school. If your child or a family member confirms the diagnosis, or your child is a "tested person" who needs nucleic acid testing, please inform the school immediately so that contingency measures can be formulated.
