## School report, May

### 1. Teachers' professional development

- a. From 5 to 7th May, Ms. Kwok Hoi Yan participated in a professional training course for Special Educational Needs Coordinators, presenting and discussing the coordination and implementation of "person-centered" and "progressive" inclusive education concepts through action research.
- b. On 9th May, the school arranged Mr. Lee Sheung Lok and Wong Chi Wai to participate in a visit to Tencent in Shenzhen, organized by the New Territories Principals' Association. The participating teachers experienced firsthand the innovative culture and work environment of a leading global technology company. The visit included a guided tour of Tencent's "non-public" headquarters, showcases of innovative technology, and interactive sessions, allowing teachers to gain in-depth insights into Tencent's cutting-edge technologies and applications in artificial intelligence, internet services, and digital entertainment, as well as content related to technological innovation and education.
- c. On 19th May, all teachers participated in a workshop titled "Dyslexia × Intervention Strategies" led by speech therapist Ms. Leung. The workshop aimed to assist teachers in flexibly supporting students with reading and writing difficulties. The speech therapist introduced the basic causes and manifestations of dyslexia, provided examples of errors students may make in the aspects of "Orthography, Phonology, and Semantics," and shared strategies to enhance phonological awareness, recognition of visually similar characters, and morphological awareness.

### 2. Students' all-round development

- a. The Primary 3 PE swimming lessons began in May. The school's Physical Education curriculum covers eight learning domains, with swimming being one of them, providing every student the opportunity to learn this fitness-enhancing skill. Each year, swimming is incorporated into the Physical Education curriculum for Primary 3 and Primary 4 to foster students' interest in the sport.
- b. To cultivate students' moral character, the school held an interdisciplinary gratitude-themed activity centered on Mother's Day in early May. The activities included writing heartfelt cards in Chinese and English classes, crafting gift boxes in Mathematics, song dedication in Music, and badge-making organized by the counseling team. Through these diverse activities, students experienced gratitude, learning to cherish family bonds and others' care, while expressing their gratitude through words and actions in daily life.
- c. On 8th May, the school held the Prize Giving Ceremony of the Month, during which numerous external academic, sports, and arts awards and certificates were presented. Teachers and students together celebrated the achievements of the awardees, and the teachers who have been nurturing the students' growth felt deeply gratified.
- d. On 9th May, the school held the Brownie Girl Scouts' pledge ceremony. This year, six new members took their oaths. The school was greatly honored to have the Commissioner attend in person to officiate the ceremony. The scouts were full of energy and solemnly pledged to uphold the Brownie Girl Scout Law.
- e. On 12th May, the school hosted the Brass Bands Concert. Musicians from the Music Office's wind ensemble performed in the school auditorium, delivering a magnificent wind music concert for all teachers and students. The audience enjoyed several famous pieces performed on various wind instruments, and students were highly engaged, learning about the characteristics of woodwind and brass instruments in Western orchestras.
- f. To broaden students' artistic sensitivity and enhance their creativity and art appreciation skills, the Visual Arts Department organized an off-campus visit for Primary 5 students to the Tea Ware Museum on 16th May. Through the activity, students had direct exposure to tea-related artifacts, explored tea culture, and developed greater creativity in tea ware craftsmanship.
