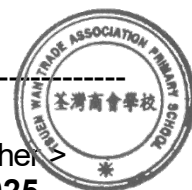

School report, June

1. Teachers' professional development

- a. On 3rd June, the Inspector from the Education Bureau's Student Support Team conducted a year-end visit to our school. During the visit, the Inspector received a comprehensive briefing on the school's initiatives in various areas from the Student Support Officer Kwok Hoi Yan, and provided valuable feedback on our programmes.
- b. From 11th to 14th June, Ms Wong Tsz Kwan participated in a study tour to Wuhan to learn more about the Mainland to enhance students' ability to develop their national identity.

2. Students' all-round development

- a. On 30th May, a group of eleven teachers and students from our school was invited to participate in the "Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macau Unity · Deep Pomegranate Seed Bond" sister school unity event held by our sister school, Shenzhen Luohu Primary School. Together with representatives from Guangdong and Macau, we gathered to take part in a vibrant cultural exchange activity that transcended geographical boundaries. This event served as a vivid lesson in national unity education and a meaningful opportunity for deep interaction among youths from Guangdong, Hong Kong, and Macau. With culture as the bridge and friendship as the bond, Shenzhen Luohu Primary School planted seeds of patriotism and unity in the children's hearts, adding a touch of hope and vitality to the future of integrated development in the Greater Bay Area.
- b. On 3rd June, the school invited 2020 Tokyo Olympics table tennis medalist and 2022 "Hong Kong Top 10 Outstanding Youth" Lee Ho Ching to share her experiences as an athlete and conduct a technical demonstration for all students. She also played matches with students and teachers from our school's table tennis team, providing guidance on table tennis techniques. On the day of the event, students experienced the joy of table tennis, and both students and teachers were highly engaged and excited!
- c. In mid-June, the school organized a series of interdisciplinary gratitude activities themed around Father's Day. These activities included a card-writing activity for Chinese and English subjects and a gift box-making activity for Mathematics. The counseling team specially arranged a phone stand design workshop to help students appreciate their fathers' hard work in supporting the family and to express gratitude for their unwavering support. Through these diverse activities, students not only learned to cherish family bonds and appreciate others' care but also practiced expressing gratitude through words and actions in their daily lives.
- d. On 16th June, CLP's "Green Studio" mobile environmental classroom visited our school, offering students a comprehensive multimedia interactive learning experience. Students watched the latest 4D sensory film Reduce Carbon, Save the Earth and engaged in interactive activities to gain a deeper understanding of global warming, smart cities, and low-carbon living. The event also enabled students to learn valuable environmental knowledge and energy-saving tips while fostering green living habits through games.
- e. To provide students with an opportunity to showcase their talents and boost their confidence, the school held the "Training Class Grand Performance" on 20th June, allowing students to take the stage and present the achievements of their sports and arts training classes to teachers and peers. The performances included jazz drumming, fancy rope skipping, Chinese dance, breakdancing, and fencing. Both teachers and students were highly engaged in the event, enjoying the students' hard work and encouraging them with enthusiastic applause.
- f. To celebrate the 20th anniversary of the New Territories School Heads Association, our school's teachers and students actively supported the mission of the "Golden Project" by participating in the "Largest Single-Event Artificial Intelligence Literacy Learning Activity" world record challenge on 24th June. Together with students from 38 other schools, we gathered to learn how to use AI tools to create text, images, and stories, and to design stories for original toys. This experience broadened the students' perspectives and sparked their interest in artificial intelligence and innovative technology.

g. To foster students' team spirit and leadership skills, the school organized a 3-day, 2-night graduation camp for sixth-grade students at Ma Wan from 25th to 27th June. Through activities such as Ma Wan exploration, adventure challenges, outdoor cooking, and raft-building, students learned interpersonal skills and bonded with their class teachers and peers, engaging in meaningful farewell activities before graduation.

3. Home-school cooperation

- a. On 13th June, the Chinese Dance Team of our school participated in the performance of "Dear Mom and Dad Cultural Performance," at Tsuen Wan Town Hall to celebrate the 28th anniversary of Hong Kong's return to the motherland. The students showed their dancing postures with full attention, and the warm applause and appreciation from the audience made the students feel happy and satisfied. The invaluable support of parent volunteers in this dance performance cannot be overstated. They took on the role of makeup artists backstage, meticulously preparing and beautifying the students. In addition to assisting with dressing and accessorizing, they provided unwavering encouragement and support to the students. We extend our sincere gratitude to these parent volunteers for their commitment and contributions, as they have truly impacted every moment of the show.
- b. Tsuen Wan Trade Association 2024-2025 Inter-School Graduation Ceremony was held on 24th June at the Kwai Tsing Theatre. On the day of the ceremony, the organizer invited Legislative Council Member Principal Chu Kwok-keung to officiate, present certificates, and deliver an encouraging speech. The Chancellor from the four schools under our association presented numerous scholarships. All Primary 6 students and their parents attended, filling the venue with a lively atmosphere. The graduates and award recipients took to the stage with confidence, receiving warm congratulations. A representative of the graduates delivered a heartfelt speech of gratitude to their alma mater and teachers. Additionally, our school's Chinese dance team performed live, and the confident performances by the graduates, award recipients, and dance team deeply moved parents and teachers alike.
