## School report, September

- 1. Teacher Professional Development
- a. On 13<sup>th</sup> September, with an aim to improve the quality of teaching and learning, our English consultant, Dr. Tang Mei Sin, conducted the lesson observation and school-based co-planning meeting which are scheduled to be held every two weeks with the English teachers to develop the school-based materials and promote the teaching strategies.
- b. On 20<sup>th</sup> September, Dr Chan Kong, officer of School-based Curriculum Development in Primary Schools, had a school-based co-planning meeting with P.4 Mathematics teachers, providing many valuable suggestions on how to improve the teaching strategies.
- 2. Holistic Development of students
- a. On 5<sup>th</sup> September, the school launched the "Big Brothers and Big Sisters" Scheme. It aims to promote the caring spirit while students learn to care for others. This scheme enables the senior form students to assist P.1 students to adapt to their new school lives and it also helps promote Positive Education on the school campus. It provides an opportunity for the senior students to learn how to take care of their juniors.
- b. In order to enhance students' knowledge and interest in marine conservation, a visit was arranged to the Cube O Discovery Park. It is the first ocean experience centre built in the city center in Hong Kong, combining the underwater world and real marine life with multimedia games. The activity aims to raise the awareness of respecting and protecting the ocean and the creatures that inhabit it.
- c. On 22<sup>nd</sup> September, our school held the Sports Day in Tsing Yi Sports Ground. It was the annual school event that students, teachers and parents were excited about. Many parents came to support their children and watch the races. Students, teachers and parents were thrilled to participate in the school event. Students strived their best and achieved outstanding results in the races.
- 3. Home-school Cooperation
- a. On 23<sup>rd</sup> September, a fund-raising event was held in cooperation with The Federation of New Territories Youth Foundation Limited to cultivate our students' interests in voluntary work at a young age. About 150 parents and students took part in the flag-selling activity, fostering the relationship between parents and students.
