Dear parents of P.4-P.6 students,

**Circular on implementing the “Bring Your Own Device” (BYOD) policy for e-learning (and Quality Education Fund e-Learning Funding Programme)**

To improve the learning efficiency of students, our school has implemented the “Bring Your Own Device” (BYOD) policy for e-learning (Circular 20-083/G05 from our school website). Apart from borrowing computer devices from our school, students are required to bring their own mobile devices to school for e-learning. To assist students from low-income families, the Education Bureau has implemented “Quality Education Fund e-Learning Funding Programme- Provision of Mobile Computer Devices and Internet Services Support”, which arranges schools to purchase mobile devices for lending to needy students (students receiving CSSA, full grant or half grant of the School Textbook Assistance Scheme) after successful application. However, for students who have applied the programme in other schools during the implementation period (2021/2022 to 2023/2024) and have not yet returned the mobile device to that school, the application will not be accepted.

Moreover, to help the needy students who cannot acquire appropriate internet services because of the limitations of their living environment (such as living in sub-divided houses, old buildings or remote areas), the Education Bureau arranges schools to purchase portable wireless network routers for lending to and / or provide mobile data cards for the needy students for e-learning at home.

Students need to return the mobile devices and / or the portable wireless network routers and mobile data cards to our school at the end of the scheme or after graduation, so we can lend them to other students in need. Our school would like to know more about if students need the above devices for e-learning or not. According to the guidelines of the Education Bureau, our school should ensure the subsidy is used properly. Therefore, when necessary, our school will collect further information from applicants.
