## School report, April

- 1. Teachers' professional development
  - a. On 22nd March, the Principal and Mr. Lee Sheung Lok attended the HKT Education Leadership Summit which aimed at integrating e-learning to address future learning challenges.
  - b. Mr. Tam Wai Wa participated in the 29th Gala for the Chinese Gardeners from 7th to 12th April. Led by the Under Secretary for Education, Mr. Sze Chun-fai, a delegation of Hong Kong principals and teachers joined the Gala for Gardeners in Hangzhou. The aim was to promote professional exchanges and cooperation among Chinese education practitioners nationwide and internationally through interaction and sharing, with the goal of mutual learning for joint development.

### 2. Students' all-round development

- a. A study tour to Shanghai and Hangzhou in China was organized by our school from 23rd to 28th March. During this six-day trip, teachers and students explored various historical sites such as the Shanghai Urban Planning Museum, Zhujiajiao Ancient Town, Town God Temple, and Song Dynasty City in Hangzhou. Additionally, they visited modern landmarks like Shanghai Xintiandi, the Bund, Huangpu River, Xihu Tiandi, and Xixi National Wetland Park to immerse themselves in the culture and customs of Shanghai and Hangzhou. Furthermore, a visit to Hangzhou Yongtian Experimental Primary School, our sister school in Hangzhou, was conducted on 26th March. Students from both schools engaged in martial arts exercises, interactive sports games, and professional calligraphy classes. They also participated in various subject lessons including Music, Science, Chinese language, Ethics, and Rule of Law, providing them with a well-rounded educational experience. The activities were enriching and beneficial for the students.
- b. On 10th April, students had the opportunity to visit the Electrical and Electronic Engineering Laboratory at the University of Hong Kong. They had a firsthand experience observing advanced robots, Al facial recognition systems, and other cutting-edge technologies. This visit not only sparked their interest in technology and engineering but also inspired them to envision potential future learning paths and career opportunities.
- c. National Security Education Day was observed on 15th April at the school. A flag-raising ceremony was held in the morning, followed by an explanation of the significance of national security and updates on its latest developments during the "Speech under the National Flag" session. Through the use of short videos, display panels, and educational games focused on national security, students were able to learn about the Constitution, the Basic Law, and national security matters. This helped them understand the importance of adhering to laws and regulations for the well-being of the nation.
- d. The Monthly Award Presentation Ceremony took place on 17th April, where numerous accolades and certificates were bestowed in the academic, STEM, sports, and arts categories from external entities. In academics, students garnered recognition for their participation in various recitation and storytelling competitions, and won the championship in the Primary Mathematics Elite Competition. In STEM, our students engaged in the Nerdy Nerdy Derby. On the sports front, students secured the first prize in the 2024 Guangdong-Hong Kong (Yunfu) Youth Football Exchange Competition and the 60th Schools Dance Festival. In the realm of arts, students achieved remarkable success by winning 2 gold medals and 1 bronze medal in the "Innovation and Technology New Generation Painting and Visual Art into the Metaverse Competition 2024". Furthermore, students showcased their talent in piano competitions.
- e. From 20th to 27th April, our school conducted the STEM New Generation Scheme for prospective Primary 1 students, offering them an opportunity to explore STEM, engage in experiential learning, and partake in enjoyable training classes.
- f. In a bid to instill a love for reading in students, the school launched the "Reading Month" Scheme in April. On 23rd April, our school actively participated in the inaugural Hong Kong National Book Day "Reading Hour" initiative for primary and secondary schools in Hong Kong. During this event, students selected their preferred books to read for an hour and completed a reflection form on their reading experience. This engaging activity sparked students' excitement and interest in delving into more books.

#### 3. Home-school cooperation:

- a. On 11th April, the school organized a session for parents of P.5 and P.6 students regarding the central allocation of secondary school placements. Information about the placement process, school selection criteria, and key considerations were shared with both students and their parents.
- b. Parents' Day was held at our school on 26th April. Parents visited the school for individual meetings with the class teacher to discuss their child's academic progress and strengthen communication and understanding of the students' recent performance. On the same day, Speech Therapist Ms. Pang conducted a session for parents on identifying and enhancing their children's language skills. Students' work was also displayed in the activity room, showcasing selected outstanding pieces for parents and students to appreciate and learn from one another.
- c. On 29th April, the school conducted a briefing and trial meeting for lunch suppliers. Seven teachers, fourteen parents, and nine students participated in the meeting, providing valuable feedback to the school on the quality, hygiene, pricing, and taste of the lunch options.
