## School report, September

### 1. Teacher Professional Development

- a. This year, the school is participating in the Primary School Chinese Language Education: Supporting Non-Chinese Speaking Students in Learning Chinese Project. Dr. Wong Man Ying, Senior Program Officer from the School-based Curriculum Development (Primary) Section of the Education Bureau, will conduct 12 on-site activities. She will engage in professional exchanges with all Chinese language teachers and assist the school in developing support measures for non-Chinese speaking students learning Chinese.
- b. On 14th and 24th September, our school's English subject consultant, Dr. Tang Mei Sin, will visit to launch this year's school-based English curriculum development plan. She will come every other week to co-plan lessons and observe classes with subject teachers, develop English teaching materials, and discuss related teaching strategies with an aim to improve the quality of teaching and learning.
- c. This year, the school continues to invite Mr. Ng Pui Wing, former Senior School Development Officer of the Education Bureau, to support the mathematics team in developing school-based Mathematics materials. On 12th September, Mr. Ng visited the school to hold a meeting and plan lessons with third-grade Mathematics teachers, providing them with valuable teaching advice.

### 2. Holistic Development of students

- a. To help Primary 1 students quickly adapt to campus life, our school launched the "Big Brothers and Big Sisters" Scheme on 4th September. Senior students guide Primary 1 students to learn about the campus and routines. The program also aims to train senior students to show care and learn to look after others, working together to build a loving and positive school culture. The teachers meticulously planned for the senior students to receive guidance on how to care for their younger peers prior to the program's commencement.
- b. On 8th and 14th September, members of our rope skipping team, traffic safety team and Year 4 performers performed rope skipping at the Tsing Yi Sports Association Sports Ground and conducting service-learning, performed and hosted game booths at the Tsing Yi Estate Mid-Autumn Festival Gala respectively, bringing joy to the residents of Tsing Yi.
- c. On 9th and 12th September, our school arranged students to participate in a pastel harmony event jointly organized with the Baptist Oi Kwan Social Service Tsing Yi Elderly Neighbourhood Centre. Through using colourful pastels, students and seniors painted together to celebrate the Mid-Autumn Festival. This activity not only taught students the importance of respecting and caring for the elderlies but also allowed the seniors to rediscover the joy of interacting with children.
- d. On 10th September, for the annual "Teachers' Day," our school made certain arrangements for students to express their gratitude and admiration for the principal and teachers. Students were encouraged to show respect and thanks through worksheets and videos. Student representatives also performed the song "Listen to Me, Say Thank You" to convey holiday greetings to the principal and teachers, appreciating their hard work and dedication to education. The counselling team guided students in presenting small tokens of appreciation to the teachers.
- e. On 17th September, our school held a Mid-Autumn Festival celebration. Students gathered to make lanterns, sharing joy and smiles during the event. Such moments help us appreciate the importance of unity and friendship, and make us cherish our school community even more.
- f. Our school collaborated with the Baptist Oi Kwan Social Service to hold the "Timebanking for Disaster Project" community support program's autumn market stall event on 21st September. Before the event, we invited students from different grades to design hand-drawn patterns on eco-friendly bags for the stalls. This meaningful event encouraged seniors to participate in volunteer services to earn time bank points, which they could use to exchange for items they liked at the market. Students learned the importance of caring for the community, experienced the joy of sharing, and expressed creativity through designing eco-friendly bags.

- g. On 28th September, JPC members participated in the "Friendly Motherland Kids Fun Day" organised by the New Territories South Regional Police Headquarters to celebrate the 75th anniversary of the founding of the People's Republic of China by conducting service-learning and hosting game booths at the Mong Kok Police Sports and Recreation Club.
- h. On 29th September, members of the Hong Kong Road Safety Team of our school participated in the flag-raising ceremony Chinese foot drill parade for primary and secondary schools and uniformed groups. The students learned a lot from the flag-raising ceremony, the methods of each team entering the venue, and the display of foot drill when leaving the venue.

### 3. Home-school Cooperation

- a. On 19th September, our school held Sports Day at Kwai Chung Sports Ground. Most students participated in track and field events, enjoying the fun of competition and exercise. Over 400 parents attended to support the students and watch the events, with many parent volunteers helping out. The school aims to teach children the spirit of "Striving for Excellence" and maintaining "Stay Humble in Victory and Resilient in Defeat". Various student service groups, such as the Scouts and Campus Reporters, contributed and applied their skills, adding more meaning to the event.
- b. The Parent-Teacher Association held its first meeting of the year on 22nd September, reporting on the renewal arrangements for executive committee positions. The arrangements of the school year conference and events were discussed.
- c. In September, the school organized several campus open days, attracting many kindergarten children and their parents to visit and understand the school's commitment to optimizing the development of learning and teaching. Parents expressed great appreciation for the school's tailored curriculum, rich English learning environment, and technology education.
