School report, February

1. Teachers' professional development

- a. From 6th to 8th February, Mr Lee Sheung Lok and Mr Wong Chi Ho traveled to Shenzhen to participate in the "Hong Kong Primary and Secondary School Robotics Education STEAM Curriculum Support and Training Program" organized by Fudan University. During the training, Associate Professor Shang Huiliang from Fudan University introduced diversified approaches to technology education and methods for effectively promoting STEAM education. Teachers engaged in hands-on activities using technology building blocks to create robot car models, such as robotic arms and mechanical vehicles, and completed assigned tasks. Subsequently, the organizers will design a series of robotics courses tailored to the school's development needs, which the school can implement in the future.
- b. From 13th to 28th February, Ms Kwok Hoi Yan, participated in an advanced course on "Catering for Diverse Learning Needs" to further improve the effectiveness of supporting students with special educational needs.

2. Students' all-round development

- a. To promote students' diverse development, the school encourages them to actively participate in various performances and competitions. Our school's Chinese dance team participated in the "61st School Dance Festival" on 24th January, performing the dance " Chopsticks Joy" (Mongolian ethnic style) at the Yuen Long Theatre, and won the "Grade A Award" in the Chinese dance (group dance) category. After the competition on the same day, the dance team immediately went to perform at Creative Kindergarten & Day Nursery (Tsing Yi) Carnival. Dressed in sparkling costumes, the students danced with pairs of agile chopsticks and fluttering ribbons, moving to a joyful melody, and thoroughly enjoyed their dance performance.
- b. On 8th February, during the "Welcoming Spring and Receiving Blessings Carnival" organized by the Tsuen Wan Trade Association Chu Cheong Kindergarten, our school's students Su Andy Wing Cheung, Lee Cheuk Nok Isaac, Chung Janine, and Yu Wing Ting, participated in service learning by hosting a booth activity. In the booth game, participants used an iPad to control a model car in front of them, directing it to move in different directions, which attracted many kindergarten students and community residents to join in. The students served enthusiastically, not only demonstrating our school's excellent organizational, communication, and expressive skills but also allowing more people to learn about our school's STEAM development.
- c. To help students understand the significance and customs of the Lantern Festival and to experience the festive atmosphere, our school organized a variety of Lantern Festival activities from 10th to 12th February. These included: Guessing lantern riddles; Chinese paper cutting; Tasting Chinese Dumpling; Thematic exhibition board showcase; Booth games; New Year book exhibition etc. On 10th February, which was both the Lantern Festival and our school's "Traditional Chinese Attire Day," many students dressed up in traditional Chinese clothing and returned to school, taking photos with teachers and classmates to capture the moment. These three days of colorful and diverse activities not only enhanced students' interest in Chinese traditional festivals and culture but also deepened their understanding of Chinese heritage.
- d. On 11th February, our school arranged for students in grades four to six to participate in an emotion management lecture as part of the "Positive Childhood Program." During the lecture, the speaker presented various scenarios to teach students how to respond to different emotional reactions and the correct methods for handling negative emotions. The students were deeply interested in the lecture, actively and enthusiastically answering the speaker's questions, and they learned a great deal about emotional knowledge and techniques.
- e. To help students experience the essence of Chinese culture, the school held a "Light and Shadow on Campus" event on 13th February, where teachers and students watched the movie *Mulan* together. The film *Mulan* tells the story of a young girl who, out of duty and loyalty, takes the place of her aging father in the army and ultimately saves the nation. Everyone

- watched with great interest. Afterward, students were tasked with writing or drawing movie reviews to express the Chinese cultural values and national spirit conveyed in *Mulan*.
- f. On 22nd February, our school participated in the preliminary round of the "All Hong Kong Schools Anti-Scam Drama Invitational Competition," organized by the Hong Kong Repertory Theatre, the Shine Tak Foundation, and the New Territories South Police District. Through this competition, the audience's awareness of scams was heightened, while students playing the roles overcame their stage fright, boosting their confidence, teamwork spirit, and performance skills.

3. Home-school cooperation

- a. From 2nd to 7th February, our school organized the "Belt and Road Initiative: Sino-Foreign Cultural Exchange Study Tour to Dubai, Abu Dhabi & Sharjah" to allow students and parents to gain a deep understanding of Arab culture and religion while experiencing life in the Middle East. They visited the Sharjah Museum of Islamic Civilization, wore traditional ethnic clothing and made date snacks at the Heart of Sharjah, enjoyed a traditional Emirati lunch at the Sheikh Mohammed Centre for Cultural Understanding, participated in various experiential activities at the Dubai Desert Conservation Reserve, admired the Burj Al Arab from a distance, and toured the Museum of the Future. They also explored other famous landmarks, such as the Dubai Frame, Burj Khalifa, Palm Jumeirah, Sheikh Zayed Grand Mosque, Louvre Abu Dhabi, and Qasr Al Watan Presidential Palace. Both students and parents gained a comprehensive understanding of the United Arab Emirates, broadening their horizons and leaving with rewarding experiences.
- b. On 21st February, our school held the "Extraordinary Achievement Celebration Party (I)" to commend students who excelled in external competitions and demonstrated outstanding individual accomplishments. Over 140 parents attended the event that day. During the ceremony, in addition to parents joining their award-winning children on stage for photos, there were also program performances, as well as sharing sessions featuring reflections from award recipients, parents, and teachers. After the ceremony concluded, the honored students, parents, and teachers participated in a celebratory tea party, enjoying a pleasant afternoon together.
