Circular on The Outstanding Student Award Scheme 2025

In order to cultivate students' positive character and strengths, to enhance their academic studies, morality and service, and face challenges with a positive attitude, the "Outstanding Student Award Scheme 2025" will be implemented. Through the "eClass Student App" platform, students can conduct the challenging tasks and earn award credits independently. The higher the points awarded, means that students have progressed in academic studies, morality and service. In addition, our school has launched a "Redeem Learning Rewards" section to commend students for actively accumulating award points. Students and parents can use the accumulated award points to select and apply redeemable learning rewards, such as book vouchers, learning toys and stationery, etc during 2nd October, 2025 to 12th June, 2026.

The school understands that parent-school cooperation is very important, so when students are performing tasks, parents can go to the "eClass Parent App" to check your child's completion of tasks and understand your child's performance in school. If the task points in the list have reached the standard and the teacher's approval is displayed, it means that the student has done well at the task. If the task points have not reached the standard and there is no teacher's approval, it means that the student needs to improve. Parents can pay more attention and encourage your children. At the same time, parents can discuss some goals with your children and move forward together. The details are as below:

After accumulating student award credits for 9 months, students will receive different award levels according to different scores:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Students ranked 1 to 80 will receive a gold award. ➤ Students ranked 81 to 160 will receive a silver award. ➤ Students ranked 161 to 240 will receive a bronze award. ➤ Merit awards will be awarded to those who ranked 241 or below, but only who have obtained 10,000 points or more in awards credits. <p>2. Every student who completes the Outstanding Student Award Scheme will receive a certificate.</p>
