## The latest developments in the school

Our school launches Inquiry-based Learning (I B Learning) to cultivate students' problem-solving skills and critical thinking through thematic exploration, making learning interesting, in-depth and meaningful. This learning style is student-centered, problem-driven. This school year, we arrange for all levels of Mathematics and General Studies (Humanities + Science) to be taught in an inquiry-based learning mode, so that students can be more motivated, more interesting and have better learning results.

What is traditional teaching? It is a one-way teaching model in which teachers directly "input" pre-prepared knowledge and conclusions to students, requiring students to memorize by rote, but ignoring students' subjectivity and thinking ability, which can easily stifle creativity.

Active Approach teaching is a student-centered instructional approach that emphasizes hands-on practice and experiential learning. It employs games, group activities, and role-playing to enliven the learning process, making it more vivid and engaging, with the aim of fostering students' creativity, collaboration skills, and problem-solving abilities.

The concept and learning mode of Inquiry-Based Learning (I B Learning) represents an extension of the principles and learning model of activity-based teaching. It possesses the following characteristics:

- Student-centered: Students construct knowledge based on specific inquiry questions.
- Process-oriented: It encompasses a cycle that includes proposing questions, conducting research, creating, discussing and reflecting.
- Through data research in groups and group discussions, it cultivates communication skills and research abilities.
- Students apply inquiry skills to foster a lifelong spirit of inquiry.



## School report, December

### 1. Teachers' professional development

- a. On 3rd December, the Development Officer of the Discipline and Guidance Section of the Education Bureau visited the school to learn about the school's situation in terms of student growth and counselling, and to learn about the school's work in promoting and developing related projects with the principal, discipline officer and social worker.
- b. From 8th to 12th December, Ms. Huang Lili attended the Professional Development Programme for the Special Educational Needs Coordinators in order to further enhance the effectiveness of the support given to students with SEN.
- c. On 16th December, the Principal, the Vice-Principal, Mr Lee Sheung Lok, Ms Wong Chuk Kwan, Mr Wong Chi Wai, Ms Lam Wai Yan and Mr Chan Chun Leung took part in an AI workshop organized by the Association of Heads of Primary School Tsing Yi District, understanding the usage of the AI-tools in the field of teaching.

### 2. Students' all-round development

- a. The school held a birthday party in December for students whose birthdays fall from September to December. Students celebrated their birthdays with their teachers and classmates. This year, the "Happy Birthday Jukebox Station" was held during the Birthday Week, and the students were very enthusiastic to participate. They took this opportunity to thank their great parents for their dedication and gratitude to their classmates and friends for their love and help.
- b. To introduce students to paleontology, earth science, and sustainable living concepts, and to cultivate their scientific thinking and environmental awareness, the school arranged students to participate in the "Fossil Deciphering Learning Programme" at Nina Park on 5th December. During the workshop, they reconstructed the original appearance of the dinosaur fossils excavated by themselves. The atmosphere was enthusiastic.
- c. Through the appreciation of moral stories from 9th to 11th December, P.1 to P.6 students gain profound insights into prudence, learning not only its definition but also its practical application in daily life. Stories narratives help students internalize the virtue, encouraging them to reflect on their own decisions and develop habits of thoughtful action.
- d. From 15th to 18th December, the English Department organized various Christmas celebration activities. Students learned to sing Christmas songs and to make snacks. They also learnt more about Christmas vocabulary and, most importantly, that they had to share their love with others.
- e. Our school holds a Christmas party every year and arranges students to perform in a talent show. Many students signed up to participate in performances such as, singing, dancing and playing the musical instruments. Unique performances will be selected and arranged at the Christmas party by the Activity Department on 19th December.

### 3. Parent-school cooperation

- a. The school has planned a two-hour preparatory class for prospective Primary One students for three consecutive weekends in December, which includes a growth lesson on learning to understand and control emotions through games, learning of gifted elements and English games. The children learned, sang and played together, and everyone quickly adapted to the new learning environment, engaged and had meaningful learning time with laughter.
- b. The PTA took advantage of the holiday following the Legislative Council Election to arrange a Giant Panda Exploration Tour for parents and students at Ocean Park. In addition to visiting the Giant Panda Pavilion to learn about the living habits of giant pandas, participating parents and students also explored the Sichuan Treasure Pavilion and various Ocean World exhibits. With over 100 families in attendance, the atmosphere was lively, making it a pleasant and informative day for both parents and children.

- c. On 9th December, a parent seminar for P.5 and P.6 students and their parents was held to let parents know about the mechanism for secondary schools' allocation. On the same day, the Assistant Principal of Wai Kiu College was invited to introduce secondary school life to the students and their parents.
